The workshop will feature guest speakers sharing **information and**

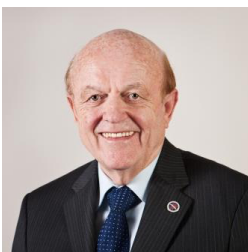
